What Are We Learning?

- Reading: Plaidypus Lost! Letters: Oo-Ss, TBC Skill: Sequencing, Setting Review, Fable Intro, PA Skill: Initial Sound, Phonemic Awareness Check, Letter Recognition Check, Syllables, Decodable Readers: Pete, Cat and Dog Play, The Little Toys, Little Me
- Sight words- the, little
- Amazing Words: platypus, around, lost, found, groceries, market
- **Heggerty-** Rhyming Words, Onset Fluency, Blending and Isolating Sounds of Words (phoneme awareness), Segmenting, Adding, Deleting, Substituting Words, Letter Naming, and Language Awareness, Syllables
- Sonday- Phonological Awareness: Recognition of Letters and Sounds, Alphabet Song, Environmental Sounds, Rhythm and Rhyme
- Math- Draw a diagram to solve problems (0-5), Name recognize, and count a quantity of 6, 7, and 8 using concrete objects, illustrations, and drawings. Recognize and write the numerals 6, 7, and 8 and represent a number of objects with a written numeral. Name, recognize, and count a quantity of 9 using concrete objects and motions.
- Writing- Handwriting Without Tears, Journal Prompts, Invitations, Diagrams
- **Unit: My Five Senses-** This week, we will SEE the world around us through our five senses.
